Endeavor to enhance Information Exchange on Nuclear Safety among Korea, China and Japan

In the post Fukushima era, there is a growing demand for promoting the international partnership through regional cooperation to cope with the nuclear safety challenges confronted by regulators.

Since 2008, Korea has been participated in the TRM (Northeast Asian Top Regulators' Meeting on Nuclear Safety) which was established among Korea, China and Japan to enhance the regional cooperation on nuclear safety in Northeast Asia. Recognizing the importance for facilitating information exchange, Korea has been playing a key role in developing an Information Exchange Framework under the TRM framework.

The Information Exchange Framework under development is expected to cover the normal situation as well as the emergency situation. For more efficient information exchange, an online information sharing system using group website is proposed, which could provide environmental radiation monitoring results, design features for the nuclear power plants and the information related to the accident (or incident).
